- Apply work procedures and systems that identify hazards and assess and manage risks through elimination or other appropriate control measures;
- Assess and continuously review the safety management and safety performance of subcontractors' and suppliers to ensure our employees are not exposed to unacceptable risks;
- Comply with all applicable laws, standards, regulations and best practices while aspiring to exceed these;
- Where practicable, apply the higher of our own standards, the customer's standards or the appropriate legislated Health and Safety requirements;
- Report, investigate and share all incidents and near misses in order to maximize learning and prevent similar events in the future;
- Conduct regular audits, inspections, reviews and reports to measure compliance with this policy and our standards, and to inform continuous improvement; and
- Foster a culture that encourages and rewards frank and fearless participation and consultation in the management of Safety and Health.
